

TEACH-BACK PROJECT

Interprofessional education occurs when members (or students) of two or more health and/or social care professions engage in learning *with, from* and *about* each other to improve collaboration and the delivery of care. In much of this course, you are learning about medicines from pharmacy trainees. Now is a chance for you to teach us about physical therapy treatments.

Work together in your groups to create a 5-minute presentation (no more than 3 slides) describing the assigned physical therapy treatment and potential medication related concerns that may be associated with it. You are not required to list specific drugs or drug classes for this presentation but rather emphasize medicine *effects* that would be problematic and the reasons for this.

For example, if the treatment in question is “standup paddleboarding” then you might predict that medicines that affect the vestibular system might cause problems with balance. Don’t overthink this; use it as a chance to solidify your knowledge of your own field while connecting it to that of another. Creativity is appreciated.
